- B. INFORMATION: Director's Report
  - The security cameras have been installed. Mandatory signs with the following statement have been ordered: "We are under 24 hour surveillance." - The STAR testing schedule has provided a "unique adventure" this year.
- Next year we will be working with Common Core Standards. There will be more integration of Math/Science and Language Arts/History. There will be an emphasis on critical thinking, such as word problems in math. This is a more powerful way of teaching than the current mode of "teaching to the test."
- There has been misinformation circulating among families about common core standards. Parents have expressed concerns about student tracking numbers which are already in existence as well as course content with common core standards.

• Dr. Dougherty met with the superintendant and director of human resources at GUSD to discuss an employee matter and our Charter renewal. We will probably present our renewal at Gateway's September or October meeting.

## C. INFORMATION: Teachers' Report

- Vanessa Burger said that prepping students before STAR testing helped them to lower anxiety levels and approach testing in a more positive manner.
- Dr. Dougherty felt the first day of testing was a disaster. The lack of organization left children in holding patterns which amped up their stress. After setting up a more organized way of handling tests, subsequent testing days went smoother.
- Vanessa Burger said that parents complained about the testing schedule. To allay their concerns, she explained to them how important this testing was for our school.
- Crickett Miller said that her son came when he didn't need to, but was okay hanging out with friends.
- Dr. Dougherty said that the preponderance of teachers did a good job, taking the testing seriously.
- Vanessa Burger discussed the STAR incentives for high school students. They can earn 2.5 to 5 credits for moving up one to two bands in their scores. She also said that students who understood their previous scores and what they needed to do to improve, were more motivated to do well.
