- B. INFORMATION: Director's Report

 - Dr. Dougherty met with Vicky Barber and Eric Premac about APL's Charter renewal. Dr. Dougherty may meet with the Gateway superintendant early in November. - liabilities. Dr. Dougherty said that teachers have been counseled to be receptive to students' needs.
- Jessica also suggested field trips, such as trips to visit colleges. She suggested having a "Festival of the Arts Day" to raise funds for field trips. Dr. Dougherty felt that students should not have to do fund raisers. Crickett Miller expressed liability concerns about field trips. At APL, parents transport children to/from field trips, alleviating the school from responsibility for student welfare when off campus. The school is responsible for students "door to door," from the time parents drop students off and until they pick them up from school.
