

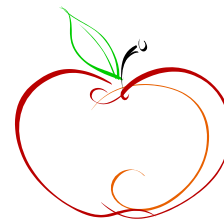

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Apple News



Greetings. We hope that you are enjoying your **Spring Break, April 1-April 8**. School resumes on **Tuesday, April 9**. Shortly thereafter, **Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR)** will take place. All public school students in grades 2-11 participate in this annual test each spring. APL encourages families to prepare their students for **STAR testing**. Ask your PLT about test prep booklets for grades 2-8 as well as STAR Released Questions for all grade levels and all subject tests. Your PLT also has access to State Blueprints, which allow teachers and parents to know what students will be tested on. State-mandated **physical fitness testing** for students in **grades 5, 7, and 9** will be given during the weeks of STAR testing. The mile run portion of the test and PFT make-ups will be at Enterprise Park on the morning of Monday, May 6, with a schedule forthcoming. Visit our website, www.ourapl.org for STAR information and schedules as well as Physical Fitness testing information and videos.

The STAR Program results are used to comply with federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) legislation, which requires that all schools meet specific academic goals. The progress of each school toward achieving these goals is provided annually in an Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) report. Each year, California schools must meet AYP goals or risk program status. APL did not meet AYP last year because our STAR scores went down. We must show improvement this year in order to have our charter renewed. If you appreciate the benefits of our program, please help us to meet our AYP goals by helping your students be prepared to do their best on their STAR test. With your help we can continue to provide the materials, services, and program offerings that you now enjoy.

We are doing everything we can to provide a positive testing environment for our students. We will extend the time to conduct STAR testing to three weeks, with students spending a portion of their day testing and the other portion in their usual classes. **April 15-April 19 will be the 1st week of testing, April 22-April 26 will be the 2nd week, and April 29-May 3 will be the 3rd week of testing.** During the 1st and 3rd weeks, students will test during the morning and have their afternoon classes as usual. During the 2nd week, morning classes will be as usual, with testing in the afternoon. By spreading the testing over three weeks, we hope that students will be able to take their time and do their very best. Home school students will test with their grade level peers. After you receive your student's STAR test and class schedule from your PLT, please make sure you have the dates/times on your calendar as attendance is extremely important. Completion of assigned schoolwork during STAR testing is also important. (Parents, please read how you can support your child during STAR testing on page 2.)

In 2015, state testing will change to a new online format. To prepare for this, APL is participating in a **Smarter Balanced Pilot Test** with one additional test for **3rd graders in Math and 4th graders in Language Arts**, which will be online. These tests are informational and will not affect student scores.

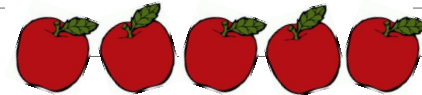

We request that students get plenty of rest the night before testing and eat a healthy breakfast to help them perform well. Please have students bring a book to read silently when they have finished their tests. APL will provide snacks, but we suggest that students bring a water bottle with a fitted lid. We hope the weather will allow students to spend time outdoors during breaks.

College Corner

Attention Juniors: The best time to take the **SAT** (Scholastic Aptitude Test) is in the spring of your junior year. Many students also decide to take the SAT again in the fall of their senior year. It is a good idea to take SAT Subject Tests in the spring while course material is still fresh in your mind. There are two more administrations of the **SAT** this spring, on **May 4 and June 1**. Learn more, register and practice at www.sat.collegeboard.org or www.sat.org/register. (You will be required to provide a photo in order to register for the SAT and SAT Subject Tests.) We have a limited number of SAT fee waivers available for students with financial need. See Sherina for info. about fee waivers.

There will be one more administration of the **ACT** on **June 8, 2013**. Go to www.actstudent.org to register.

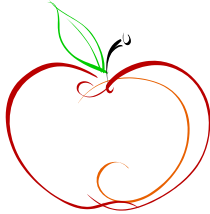
Juniors, spring is a good time to visit some local colleges—large, small, public and private, to get a feel for what works for you. Develop a list of colleges that are of interest to you. Request viewbooks and information about financial aid and academic programs. Perhaps you can visit some colleges during spring break.

Seniors, you should receive college acceptance letters and financial aid offers by mid-April. Colleges cannot require your deposit or your commitment to attend before May 1. By that postmarked date, you must inform every college of your acceptance or

rejection of the offer of admission and/or financial aid.

The **Golden State Seal Merit Diploma** (GSSMD) provides **recognition** to graduates who have demonstrated mastery of the high school curriculum as **demonstrated by their scores on STAR tests**. To qualify for the GSSMD, students must be receiving a high school diploma, and must have earned a scale score of 370 or above on six qualifying California Standards Tests. *Many students don't think their scores matter on STAR tests, but they do! Students who earn a GSSMD will receive an insignia on their diploma and their transcript, which may be helpful for college acceptance and scholarships.*
